As you know, Gary Puckett and the Union have had three straight gold records, starting with "Woman, Woman." It sounds like their fourth is on its way up with "Don't Give In to Him." (Columbia).

This has a compelling lyric line — telling the girl not to surrender to another guy's line — and Gary's great voice. Somehow this one doesn't send me quite as much as the others, but a medium Union Gap is better

than the top effort of many another group.

The Fifth Dimension's "Aquarius Let the Sunshine In" is being billed as the song of our time by the group for all times. And it very nearly is. As you know, the tunes were taken from the rock musical "Hair." It would seem very hard for the Dimension to fail with all the rhythm and verve they have going for them.

Just heard the dub that The Damnation of Adam Blessing made down at

Cleveland Recording. It's very good. This may be the start of a national hit.

Particularly interesting is one about technicolor day-dreams and one, "Don't Let Me Wander Too Far."

It's easy to guess that "These Eyes" by the Guess Who? (RCA) and "Didn't You Know You'd Have to Cry Sometime" by Gladys Knight and the Pips (Soul) are headed for heavy play. The Guess Who? are a Canadian group who have made it up North.

Miss that old Mamas and Papas sound? You can hear it again in Mama Cass' "Move in a Little Closer Baby" (Dunhill).
