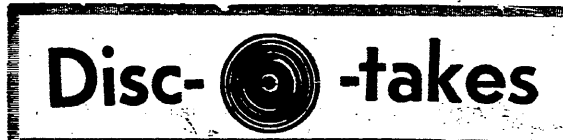

If his name is Nilsson he can. And has.

This RCA artist who hit the jack pot with "Everybody's Talkin'" has a delightful LP out, "Nilsson Sings Newman." It should make quite a healthy deposit in his savings account.

All 10 songs were written by Randy Newman. And they vary from a nostalgic turn-of-the-century "Dayton, Ohio 1930" to a zesty "Yellow Man."

The stand-out is "I'll Be Home," a real smash of a soft song. (I'll be home—When you nights are troubled—and you're all alone...) There's much of the "Everybody's Talkin'" feeling to this.

Another favorite was "Living Without You," highlighted with background harmony. He also scores with "Cowboy," the song about cold grey buildings where a hill should be.

"Caroline" is a simple, satisfactory melody. Other features are "Vine Street," "Love Story," "So Long Dad," "The Beehive State."

Newman plays the piano

on all the tracks. Also on the record are Allen Zentz, Pat Leraci, Michael Leary and Steve Barncard.

"Right On" is Wilson Pickett's newest Atlantic release and it's right on the dot. A 12-pack of punchy songs.

If you haven't heard this dynamo sing the top song of the year, "Sugar, Sugar", you're in for a treat. This version really has feeling.

What he does on his own "Funky Way" and "This Old Town" is terrific. There's that old zippy beat and his great, vibrant voice. "This Old Town" is about a place that has "love between the races," a true contemporary commentary.

Pickett pulls out all stops on his "Groovy Little Woman," "Sweet Inspiration" and the old Holland-Dozier Holland "You Keep Me Hangin' On."

And would you believe a wind up with a spiritual, "Steal Away"? Great.

The Cold Grits are the rhythm section on almost half the songs, the Muscle Shoals Rhythm Section on others.

Another singer with one

name, Jennifer, could be a blockbuster. This former member of the West Coast "Hair" cast has a London album, "See Me, Feel Me, Touch Me, Heal Me!" that in a word is fascinating.
