

'Ice Capades' Booms Despite Steel Strike

"Ice Capades" is reported to be doing close to blockbuster business at the Cleveland Arena, despite the steel strike. Officials of the show say it drew 100,834 persons who paid \$292,000 to see the 20th birthday edition during the first 11 days.

In New York the revue recently racked up a record \$550,000 in 16 days at Madison Square Garden. It runs through Sunday here, with weekend matinees at 1:30 and 5:30 p.m.

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — A seaman aboard the destroyer USS Waller has been reported missing at sea and presumed drowned.

Everett McCloud Jr., 20, of Ironton, O., was discovered missing during night anti-submarine exercises 350 miles east of Jacksonville, Fla.

Ships and planes in the exercise conducted a fruitless search, a naval spokesman said yesterday. Further details were unavailable immediately.



